Staying connected overseas

1. Roaming - - Use your existing SIM card with global roaming

- Data roaming is more expensive overseas. You can pre-purchase data to use overseas, or set up an overseas daily data plan at a much lower rate.
- Eg Telstra \$10day 1GB data and unlimited calls. You need this if you want to receive calls on your number.
- Unused data does NOT rollover to the next day.

How to set it up: In the settings, enable data roaming. Check with your provider for specific instructions

2. Local SIM

- Take advantage of local rates by buying a pre-paid SIM in your destination country (or buy one before you leave).
- This card will give you a temporary 'local' phone number and a lot more data at a lower price
- You will need to take your Australian SIM out of your phone and keep it safe.
- You won't receive calls or texts on your Australian phone number.

How to set it up: Before you leave, ask your Australian operator whether your smartphone is locked to the network. If not, it's simply a matter of inserting the new SIM when you arrive.

3. Use WI-FI

- If you don't use your mobile much, turn on Flight (Aeroplane) mode and connect to hotel Wi-Fi
- Flight mode disables your Mobile network you can't receive calls or messages while it's switched on.
- You can access the internet via Wi-Fi (eg. check email)
- You can make calls via WhatsApp ONLY to those in your WhatsApp contact list.

How to set it up: Simply select the available wi-fi network and and follow the steps. Be careful when using free wi-fi as its possible for someone else on the network to snoop on your information.

4. eSIM

- Integrated into the phone's hardware (2018+) and can be linked to multiple carriers with different rates and plans (called profiles).
- Your local telco provider or for example www.Airalo.com
- When you can't access Wi-Fi and need data then use your eSim for cheap data and outbound calls.

How to set it up: Choose provider & follow steps



Options for accessing money

- 1. ATMs (beware of very high fees charged with Euronet ATMs). Transaction fees and conversion fees apply each time
- 2. Credit Cards. Transaction fees (3-7%) and conversion fees apply each time TIP: Download your bank's app before you leave as fees will appear right after each transaction
- 3. Money cards such as **WISE** (<u>www.wise.com</u>). Lower transaction fees (~0.4%) and better conversion rates.

Google Maps – Offline.

You can save an 'AREA' of google maps to your phone and then use it when you are offline (so not using data). You can chew through hundreds of \$\$ if you use maps on data.

- 1. Open Google maps (do this at home or use hotel wifi).
- 2. Type in a place in the search bar (eg Milan then select the correct Milan eg Milan city Italy).
- 3. Zoom in or out to select the section of the map that you want to use.
- 4. Tap 'X' in the search bar and then tap your profile icon (Top RH corner circle).
- 5. Scroll down then Tap 'Offline maps'.
- 6. Tap 'Select your own map'.
- 7. Then use both fingers to zoom in or out and move around to select the map section you want (the more the better)
- 8. Tap 'download' at bottom RH corner.
- 9. Name the map tap on 3 dots on RHS of Map 1 and tap 'Rename' then type a name and tap 'Save'
- 10. Do this for all the cities / places you want to visit

To access the map when your data is turned off (Flight mode)

- 1. Tap Your profile icon/name (top RH corner circle)
- 2. Tap on 'Offline Maps'
- 3. Scroll down to select the name of the map and tap it to open.
- 4. Tap on the map image (do not tap on delete/update)
- 5. Now all the info on the map is there you can zoom-in to street names etc you also have info on restaurants/hotels etc
- 6. You can still search that map for places or names in that map
- 7. You can see where you are (blue dot in white circle) and navigate to a place (tap place name or address in search bar).

Google Translate.

- 1. Download Google Translate app from Apple Store or Google Play
- 2. Select languages you want to download (so you can use them offline). Do this using at home before you go using wifi.
- 3. Once you have finished downloading your selection then tap the 'X" in top LH corner
- 4. Select the 'from' & 'to' languages





- 5. Enter text either typing it or speaking it (use microphone on keyboard).
- 6. Once you have finished tap the 'arrow in the blue circle'.
- 7. You will see the translation text in Blue
- 8. Tap on the 'arrow in blue circle again' to hear the translation by tapping the microphone directly under the translation

Google Translate Tips:

TIP 1: If you can't understand what someone is saying.

Then switch the 'to' & 'from' at the bottom of the screen – tap on the 2 arrows in between the 2 languages .

Tap on 'Enter text' and tap on microphone in keyboard then ask them to speak into the phone.

As they are speaking the translation will appear – tap the arrow in blue circle to stop **Tip 2: Save a favourite saying.**

Once you have the translation, tap on star in top RHS, This will then be added to your favourites. To access favourites – tap Home (top LH) then tap Star (top LH), To remove favourite simply open favourites, and tap on a star to delete.

Tip 3: To translate a sign

Choose the 'from' & 'to' language.

Tap the Camera icon (bottom RH) and point the phone at the sign , hold still until the translation appears (only a few seconds). If you need to keep the image then simply take a screen shot.
